
## My NASA Data - Lesson Plans

# **Nonattainment Areas: Zoom In Inquiry**



#### Overview

Students will engage in a "Zoom In Inquiry" learning routine to understand a world map that shows changes in  $PM_{2.5}$ -attributable mortality per 100,000 population (Bondie, 2013). They will make initial observations and inferences of small sections of the map. Then, they will be intellectually careful as they interpret the map key and color scale. Lastly, they will reflect on how their perception of the image changed as they saw more of the image.

# **Materials Required**

- Zoom In Inquiry Student Sheet
- Nonattainment: Zoom In Inquiry Slides
- <u>Legend: Counties Designated "Nonattainment" or "Maintenance"</u> Note: Teachers color print one legend per group of students. It is recommended that teachers place legend in a plastic sheet protector for reuse.


### **Technology Requirements**

### **Teacher Background Information**

Use the document <u>EPA "Nonattainment" or "Maintenance" Counties</u> for teachers to reference or show to students at the end of the lesson.

### **Procedure**



Map of counties designated as "nonattainment" or "maintenance" areas by the Clean Air Act's National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

**Instructions:** Display images for the class to observe. With each image, there will be a question. As students observe the images, have them follow the steps below:

- 1. **Think:** On your "Zoom In Inquiry Student Sheet," jot down a response to the question that is posted on each slide. (1 min)
- 2. **Pair:** Talk with a partner about your response to the question that is posted. (1 min.)
  - Respond with follow-up questions:
    - What makes you say that?
- 3. Share: Call on 2-3 students to share out. (1 min.)
